

Change in clinic hours for the Medication Refill Clinic at Kimbrough Ambulatory Care Center

At Kimbrough Ambulatory Care Center (KACC) we are continuously trying to improve the quality and access to care for our patients. To prevent patients from running out of medication before an appointment, KACC offers a Medication Refill Clinic run by doctors of pharmacy.

Patients who are Prime to Kimbrough and are over the age of 18 may use the Medication Refill Clinic. The Medication Refill Clinic is a walk-in clinic so no appointment is needed. Patients will meet with the pharmacist to make sure the medication is safe and effective. The pharmacist will be able to provide enough medication until the patient's scheduled appointment or enough until they are due to be seen again.

There are some medications the pharmacist can not refill, these include:

- Medications for patients under the age of 18
- Medications for pregnant patients (unless it is for prenatal vitamins)
- Certain medications used to treat pain (example: narcotics or controlled substances)
- Medications used to treat depression or psychiatric disorders
- Medications used to treat infections (example: antibiotics)
- Medications originally prescribed by a civilian doctor

Beginning Monday August 2nd, 2010 the Medication Refill Clinic has changed their hours, new hours of operation are from 7:30am to 11:30am Monday through Friday.
